RECENTLY Calder Action Group Inc, Brimbank Council and Calder Highway Improvement Committee unanimously agreed that the next major development will be the Calder Park Drive/Calder Freeway interchange.

This will be the second stage in a four-part strategic process for this section of the Calder Freeway.

We will shortly convey this decision to VicRoads and our state and federal representatives for future funding consideration.

Current planning on the first-stage Kings Road/Calder Freeway interchange is well advanced and we are hopeful that works will begin in the later part of next year.
